
at Carnegie Hall as the winner of national competition.






CHRISTOPHER YUN VIOLIN

Lauded for her "particularly lovely" playing and "boundless creativity", pianist Candace Chien is an versatile performer and teacher in the New York City area. Recent concert season appearances includes chamber music performances at Kimmel Center Perelman Hall and Academy of Music, Trinity Wall Street St. Paul's Chapel, New Hampshire Music Festival, as well as a solo concerto appearance with Chelsea Symphony performing Saint-Saens Piano Concerto No. 2. Candace maintains relationships with On Site Opera, Fresh Squeezed Opera and Opera On Tap as repetiteur, and has appeared as part of On Site Opera's collaboration in Caramoor's 2022 summer season alongside Stephanie Blythe and Laquita Mitchell. She was also chosen as Music for Autism's Spotlight Artist of 2022, advocating for neurodiverse classical music experiences with "extraordinary artistry and humanity".

She has held piano faculty positions at International Music Academy in Castelnuovo di Garfagnana, Usdan Center of Creative and Performing Arts and Point Counterpoint Chamber Music Festival, as well as music teaching positions in the public schools of Westfield, New Jersey and Queens, New York. She appears as a master clinician for Anemone Music Studio, and Main Line Music Teachers Association. Candace is a graduate of The Juilliard School, studying with Jonathan Feldman and Margo Garrett, and continues on at Juilliard as one of their staff pianists. She received her Master's degree in piano performance at the Manhattan School of Music with the guidance of Jeffery Cohen and obtained her undergraduate degree in piano performance and music education at Temple University under Professor Harvey Wedeen. In her spare time between teaching and performing, one can also find Candace in the kitchen. Her personal connection to music and food can be seen on Food Network tv show, Cooks Versus Cons, Season 4 in the episode "Fry, Fry Again!".

Nicholas Pappone

VIOLIN

Lauded as a "first rate" violinist by Maestro Lorin Maazel, Nicholas Pappone makes a diverse career as soloist, chamber musician, orchestral player, and teacher in New York City. Growing up as a professional child actor in Los Angeles, portraying the role of a prodigy violinist in a film inspired his interest in the instrument. Nicholas has performed with members of the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, the Emerson String Quartet, the New York Philharmonic, Vienna Piano Trio, and the Zukerman Chamber Players. This includes collaborations with violists Paul Neubauer, Paul Coletti, Jethro Marks, and the cellists Paul Watkins and Tchaikovsky Competition Gold Medalist, Sergey Antonov.

In 2022-23, Nicholas appeared as soloist in the Beatles Fantasy Concerto with Diane Wittry conducting the Garden State Philharmonic, and John Williams movie score solos with Michael Butterman conducting the Lancaster Symphony. Past seasons have included performances of the Bernstein Serenade with the Chelsea Symphony, and appearances with the Marina del Rey Symphony, the Pacific Palisades Symphony, New York Session Symphony, and the New Westchester Symphony.

Guest concertmaster or principal engagements include the Allentown Symphony, Reading Symphony, Binghamton Philharmonic, Mount Vernon Virtuosi, Wicked on Broadway, as well as performing as a guest musician in the Baltimore Symphony. He also appeared with the Cleveland Orchestra as violinist and actor in a unique collaboration with actor John De Lancie. Recent recital and chamber music highlights include the Kimmel Center Perelman Theater and Academy of Music, Philadelphia, the Boulder International Duo Competition, Rutgers University, Islip Arts Council, Bar Harbor Chamber Music Festival, Grunin Center for the Arts, WMP Concert Hall's Strad for Lunch, Teatro Principal of Burgos, Spain, Cathedral of St. John the Divine, the National Arts Centre of Ottawa, and Heliconian Hall in Toronto, Canada.

In the summers, Nicholas is violin and chamber music faculty at the Summit Music Festival and Institute NY, International Academy of Music in Tuscany, Italy and the Burgos International Music Festival in Spain. Nicholas's teachers and mentors include Patinka Kopec, Pinchas Zukerman, Rodney Friend, and Grigory Kalinovksy.

Gloria Kim


Cellist Gloria Kim has appeared in the US and across the globe as both a soloist and sought-after chamber musician. She has performed extensively in renowned concert venues in the New York metropolitan area such as Merkin Hall, Steinway Hall, Alice Tully Hall and Carnegie Hall and has toured throughout Europe, China and Korea. She has also performed in many orchestras under renowned conductors, including a tour with Andre Previn. Other highlights include performing at the UN, US Capitol, and for the US President, Bill Clinton.

She has been invited to appear as faculty, concert artist, and to present master classes at the Pan Music Festival at the Seoul National University, Sarasota Music Festival, Verbier Music Festival, 4String Music Festival, Triumph Music Festival, and Summit Music Festival amongst others.

Her first album, "An Evening of Sentimental Classics," includes the great works of Chopin, Rachmaninoff, and Schumann with the Pianist Sehwan Park, and was released in April 2023 in Korea, sponsored by Huks Music.

Born into a family of professional musicians, Gloria studied at the Curtis Institute of Music and Manhattan School of Music, where she had the privilege to study under Peter Wiley, David Soyer, Joseph Silverstein, Gary Graffman, Felix Galimir, and the Guarneri String Quartet.

She is a founding member of the BeneSori Quartet, member of the Trio Portinari, and on a faculty at the County College of Morris and the Summit Music Festival in New York.



DR. JINHA PARK PROGRAM DIRECTOR

"Pianist Jinha Park demonstrated ample dexterity, velocity, and accuracy in Chopin's Piano Concerto in F Minor." - San Antonio Express-News Jinha Park stands today on the brink of a significant career as a concert pianist, shaped by a journey spanning three decades and enriched by a mosaic of global experiences. Dr. Park made her public debut at fourteen with the Sunha Arts Orchestra. Her

arts based education commenced at Seoul National University in South Korea and culminated at the Johns Hopkins Peabody Conservatory in the U.S. A laureate of competitions, Dr. Park's journey has been adorned with victories in the Vienna Allegro Vivo International Chamber Music Competition, Burgos International Music Competition, Baltimore Music Competition, and the Texas Music Teachers Association (TMTA) competition. Noteworthy engagements include performances with the Virtuoso Brunesis Orchestra (Italy), Vienna CMS Chamber Orchestra, Festival Philharmonic Orchestra (Korea), National Orchestra of the Dominican Republic, Oltenia Symphony Orchestra (Romania), Alicante Symphony Orchestra (Spain), Romanian Timisoara Orchestra (Romania), and performances across Italy, Germany, France, Belgium, Austria, Korea, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, and major cities in the United States. Dr. Park has contributed her discerning expertise as a jury member at international competitions, including the International Youth Competition' A Step Towards Mastery' in Saint Petersburg, Russia, the ICA International Piano Competition in Hanoi, Vietnam, the Virginia Queen Piano Competition in the U.S., the New York Musicians Club in the Seoul International Piano Competition, the Sunhwa Piano Competition in Seoul, and the OMTA (Oregon Music Teachers Association) Classical Music Competition in Portland. Additionally, she has lent her discerning insights to the Kirov International Music Competition in Washington, D.C., and the Northern Virginia Music Teachers' Association Concerto Competition. Beyond the spotlight, Dr. Park's commitment to education and artistic leadership shines through. She has served as the Director of the Music Fest Perugia in Seoul and on the faculty of the Music Fest Perugia in Italy, Summit Music Festival, Montecito International Music Festival, Triumph International Music Festival, Portland Classical Festival, Ouachita International Keyboard Music Festival, Washington International Piano Festival, and Costa Rica International Music Festival. Her teaching roles include positions at the University of Maryland University College, August State University, Sookmyung Women's University, and Sunhwa Arts Performing Arts High School. Currently, Dr. Park holds the position of Associate Director at the Colorado International Piano Academy and Festival, Chair of the YMIC Virtuoso International Music Competition (U.S.), and U.S. Associate Director of the Amigdala International Music Competition (Italy). Her role as Department Manager and Piano Faculty at Levine Music adds a harmonious note to her illustrious career.



JULIEN BENICHOU, MUSIC DIRECTOR & CONDUCTOR, ACCORD SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

Conductor Julien Benichou is making his mark as a champion for the future of classical music. Currently, Benichou is the Artistic Director of the Washington Opera Society (WOS), and Music Director of the Chesapeake Youth Symphony Orchestra (CYSO). In 2023, he became Music Director of the Accord Symphony in Washington, DC.

Before coming to the United States, Benichou studied harmony and counterpoint with Pierre Doury at the Schola Cantorum in Paris. Benichou received a Graduate Performance Diploma from the Peabody Institute and earned a Master's Degree from Northwestern University. His primary teachers have been Victor Yampolsky, Gustav Meier, and Jorma Panula.

As a guest conductor, Benichou has garnered high acclaim through his work with the New York City Ballet, and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra's collaborations with Mobtown Modern Synchronicity. Recent guest engagements have included conducting the Portuguese Philharmonic at the Champs-Elysees Theater in Paris, the Dallas Symphony, the Pasdeloup Orchestra in Paris, and the Stellenbosch Music Festival. Upcoming concerts include a return engagement for Christmas with Tim Janis at Carnegie Hall, a Kennedy Center debut with the Accord Symphony.

As Music Director of the Mid-Atlantic Symphony for 17 seasons, Benichou dramatically raised the professional quality of the ensemble. His leadership of the MSO led to collaborations with Stefan Jackiw, Kurt Nikkanen, Leon Fleisher, Arnaud Sussmann, and Tine Thing Helseth. Benichou has also found great success in conducting operatic productions. With the Washington Opera Society, Benichou recently concluded productions of The Magic Flute, Aida, and Carmen in Washington, DC.

In 2017, Benichou premiered "Way of the Rain" at Carnegie Hall, a climate change awareness project featuring Robert Redford and Vice President Al Gore. A repeat performance was held in 2021 in Monte-Carlo, in the presence of his Highness Albert II, Prince of Monaco. Benichou serves on the advisory board of the Way of the Rain foundation.

Benichou has also received numerous commissions for theater, film, and concert music, most recently arrangements for French rock musician Arthur H. Julien Benichou is the lead conductor and creative partner for Environmental Symphony: The Movement. Benichou brings natural musicality, infectious energy, and a creative approach that is fostering the next generation of classical musicians.
